WSEA October 2018 Assembly Inventory

A motion was made and passed at a 2013 WSEA Assembly held in Pasco, WA where Area 92 will set aside 2 hours at all non-election October Assemblies for an Area Inventory. The inventory is to be hosted by a past Delegate. The inventory will contain 3-5 questions which could come from any or all of the following: Home groups, GSR roundtable, DCM roundtable meetings or the Area Committee.
