Greetings WSEA 92 and welcome to a few excerpts from the General Service Conference's Current Conference Charter!

It will not be easily contradicted, that Bill W. invested enormous personal energy, time, and thought, over at least a decade, to expand the underlying principles embodied in the Twelve Steps and Traditions, and formulate an A.A. organization that would:

- 1. Serve as "...the guardian of world services and of the Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions...";
- 2. "...act for A.A. in the perpetuation and guidance of its world services, and it will also be the vehicle by which the A.A. movement can express its view on all matters of vital A.A. policy..."; and,
- 3. "... in all its proceedings...shall observe the spirit of the A.A Tradition...taking great care that the Conference never becomes the seat of perilous wealth or power;...that none of the conference members shall ever be placed in a position of unqualified authority over any others; That all important decisions be reached by discussion, vote, and, whenever possible by substantial unanimity; that no Conference action ever be personally punitive or an incitement to public controversy;...and that, like the Society of Alcoholics Anonymous which it serves, the Conference itself will always remain democratic in thought and action."

The above are just small portions of 3 of the Articles of the Conference Charter and includes most of the 6 Warranties contained in Article 12. The full 4½ page text is available as Appendix C., starting on page S105 of "The A.A. Service Manual Combined With The Twelve Concepts". Please take the time to read it, twice if possible. You may conclude as have others, that it is a truly powerful guiding document for A.A. On close examination you will note, even with the praise, that Bill along with others submitted several amendments (referenced in the footnotes) which were voted on and approved up through his death in 1971, and beyond.

I have personally concluded it is both foundational and existential to A.A. More importantly, I have learned that virtually all of the General Service trusted servants I have come to know well, embrace that same view. Further, after participating in two General Service Conferences, I can readily report that every other General Service conferee I have seen or heard over the last couple of years, shares that same devotion to this inspiring document.

Bill's development of an organizational formula, precisely suited to the needs of the A.A. movement, is fulfilling his vision very well.

COVID STORY FROM Edward S.

I reside west of Deer Park, subsequently, I have never been availed the opportunity to attend an inperson 3of5 group gathering. However, I do presently attend the meetings, via the ZOOM platform, on a relatively consistent basis. I also regularly attend the affiliated "Knuckleheads Men's Literature," ZOOM meeting, on Monday night.

I was introduced to this group through an AA acquaintance, who spoke affably of it, and, who also attends it periodically. I appreciated both, the cordiality with which I was received while attending my first ZOOM supported meeting, as well as what I perceived to be a solution-based format. Hence, I have continued to attend the ZOOM supported 3of5 meetings for several months.

Prior to the "March Madness" pandemic event of 2020, I attended seven weekly in-person meetings of diverse format, in the greater Spokane area. I was quite deliberate in my electing to attend meetings that were primarily solution based, "newbie friendly," meetings, or educationally based gatherings such as STEP, Big Book, or AA sanctioned literature meetings. Several of these groups hosted a speaker once per month as well.

The solution oriented, topical, format of the 3 of 5 meeting appealed to me right away. The majority of the individual sharing rarely strays "off point." Subsequently, it renders a consistent Big Book based, solution focused, forum. Thus, precipitating the facilitation of addressing the day-to-day AA challenges of maintaining physical and emotional sobriety, while also promoting efficacious AA service.

Had it not been for the ZOOM format, I believe that I can state, with unequivocal confidence, I would not have been availed the opportunity, and privilege, of gleaning from the Encouragement, Strength, & Hope, engendered by the membership of the 3of5 group.

In short, I believe ZOOM to be a Divinely developed, and Providentially placed, tool for such a time as this. And, that it has been strategically implemented for the intent purpose of perpetuating the propagation of the AA message.

It is to the credit of the 3 of 5 group conscience that this format was adopted, and efficaciously implemented. It represents the most viable means by which the group can effectively maintain continuity with, and nurture, the broadest scope of their individual, as well as the corporate, AA Fellowship's membership.

I foresee ZOOM as continuing to be an integral part of the AA service strategy for many years to come!!
