Welcome to more summer in Area 92, along with more "life on life's" terms.

Living this life on its terms, sober, is markedly more manageable than it was in the days when I was regularly anesthetized from the realities around me.

Here is a straightforward example. Ten days ago, Jane and I were evacuated from our home with the very fast spread of the Red Apple Fire across Sunnyslope. In a matter of just a few hours, in the extremely hot weather and high winds, this wildfire raced 3 miles from its starting point and was 150 yards from our property at 11:30 PM when we received the level-3 alert.

Fortunately, we had packed important information and keepsakes when the level-2 alert sounded at 8:30 pm. So, we loaded up both the car and pickup with all the packed boxes, a couple of suitcases, two dogs and a bird. As we exited our drive at the cul-de-sac at 11:45, one fire engine was in the circular drive of a house across from us, pumping water on flames directly behind it. We made two telephone calls from the car and found accommodations at 1:00 AM in a downtown Wenatchee hotel which offered discounted rates for evacuees, and let us keep our animals.

At 6:00 am the next morning. while driving north on Wenatchee Avenue, the entire 9-mile-wide southern face of Birch Mountain and its Sunnyslope foothills were blackened, above the areas of housing! While no structures were lost, the fire continued to burn and spread for 4 more days.

Once again, this experience illustrates that with a clear mind we can choose the next right thing, and then leave the outcome to a power greater than ourselves. A fifth of Wild Turkey "101" would not have helped. Our sober life is "the easier, softer way."

Area Archivist -COVID STORY FROM Caroline K.

Caroline K. - Best 3 out of 5 was the first AA meeting I attended when I moved to Spokane in 2013. I chose it because I could attend on my lunch hour. There were about 5 core members. It reminded me a lot of my home group in Salt Lake - down-to-earth, practical and solution-based. There was also a lot of long-term-sobriety, and a good sense of humor. I became a home group member and then GSR.

Over the next 7 years, some older members moved or otherwise left the meeting, but the meeting generally increased in numbers. By January of 2020 we regularly had meetings with 20 people (or close to it). Only 1 or 2 members from 2013 still attended (although I believe the others are still sober).

I stopped attending meetings in person fairly early in the pandemic. I went without meetings for a few weeks, waiting for the rest of Best 3 out of 5 to come around to my way of thinking. I didn't attend other meetings online even though I knew that 3 meetings a week is my sweet spot. Bad idea. It was a terrible time to be away from AA. While I had no desire to drink, I was drowning in

fear. I ran around desperately doing things like joining a group that was sewing masks for the fire department.

One day in early March I got miserable enough to look up online meetings and I went down to my basement in a down jacket and signed on to a group from downtown Spokane. The people at the meeting were warm and welcoming the way AA usually is, but it was all the more precious because those had been some lonely and fearful days for me. At the end of the meeting, they read from the last page of "A Vision for You", ending with "... as we trudge the road of happy destiny. May God bless you and keep you until then." I promptly burst into tears (which I hid from the camera) because the familiar words reminded me that I wasn't alone. I still attend that meeting, as well as several others I found online in the next weeks.

Having worked remotely for many years, conference calls and technology were not a personal challenge to me. What was weird was bringing AA members into my home. It's also a little weird being in a meeting with my non-alcoholic husband in the next room. But the basement was just too cold!

A few weeks later, the home group decided to stop meeting in person. We quickly got a Zoom account and have been meeting remotely on Monday, Wednesday and Friday at noon since March 23. We left a note on the door of our meeting place and also put a link on the meeting schedule at aaspokane.org. A lot of people who attended in person have not shown up online. Sometimes we have only 4 or 5 people (like we did in 2013) but Best 3 out of 5 is always there at our scheduled time, as it has been since 1990. I am grateful to be part of this long history and tradition.

Our meeting format is unchanged. We welcome newcomers, celebrate birthdays, read from the book and share our experience, strength and hope. We also joke and laugh. When we pray, we hold our palms toward the camera – it's as close as we can get to holding hands. We have newcomers who have never met the group in person, but I think they feel they are part of it.

I personally never imagined a year like this one. I never even wondered how or what AA would do in these circumstances. I'm grateful and amazed at how quickly AA has adapted to the reality of today. It's something of a miracle really, that AA's traditions and steps have made it possible for all of us to stay connected and stay sober in these unexpected and challenging times when many organizations and business have not been able to stay afloat. I believe it is testament to our traditions of common welfare, primary purpose, unaffiliated, avoid public controversy, principles before personalities – that we are alive and well.

So here it is, Christmas Eve. Best 3 out of 5 will be meeting tomorrow and welcoming anyone who has a desire to stop drinking. As long as there are 2 or more, we have a meeting. I hope lots of people will pop in, especially a couple newcomers were are just getting to know. I am sorry that we don't get to share excessive amounts of cookies and other treats; sorry that we won't be in our dark, damp little cemetery basement drinking coffee from the large urn in the corner, won't be hugging, won't be holding hands and praying together. But there are always things to be sorry about.

More than anything, I'm very grateful for AA and the fellowship of AA. I came here to stop drinking so that I wouldn't die. As I stayed, I learned that stopping drinking is the beginning, not the end of my AA experience. "Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps" I find myself able to stay sober, and to live my best life even in the midst of a global pandemic.

I'd prefer to meet (safely) in person. I'd also prefer to be 30 again, tall, beautiful and fearless. Those last few are not looking promising, so I guess I'll just continue with being a sober member of Alcoholics Anonymous living a useful life. One day at a time.
