Area Alternate Delegate

Hi, I'm Dan, and I'm an alcoholic.

My sobriety date is January 10, 1979.

It is an honor to serve as the Alternate Delegate and Registrar for Washington East Area 92, and I'm a proud member of the Northern Lights home group in Spokane WA, which meets at 7:30 p.m. on Mondays. It's an amazing group!

The longer I'm sober, the more I'm struck by a deep sense of gratitude. Seeing a room full of sober people moves me to tears. Nothing I can say is more powerful than the simple fact that you and I did not have to drink today.

When I first stumbled into AA, all I wanted was to stop drinking. I'd reached the point where I knew alcohol wasn't making things better, yet I'd still pick up a drink and not stop until I ran out or passed out. I was trapped in hopelessness, knowing my own mind was betraying me. That was my bottom, but I kept drinking anyway.

By a loving intervention, I ended up in what we used to call a "jitter joint"—a treatment center that expected me to work the Steps. I was desperate and wasn't sure they would work, but I knew I couldn't think my way out of this. So I started. I worked a 5th Step and even made some 9th Step amends to my family while I was there. And a miracle happened for me. As the 10th Step promises, I was a free man. It took a long time to trust it, though. I worried that life would eventually give me something so big, I'd have to drink. But after walking through many of life's challenges without even thinking of a drink, I finally grew in faith that this program was the solution to all my problems.

"The best way to help others stay sober is to stay sober yourself." My first sponsor, Jim, told me that many times. It gave me a purpose at a time when I wasn't sure I had one.

Lately, I've been focused on the purpose of prayer and meditation. I've learned that if I'm struggling with a Step, it usually means I need to revisit the ones before it. For example, if I try to meditate while I'm angry, my mind just spins, rationalizing my resentment or plotting revenge. That's my cue to work Step 10. That means taking a fearless inventory (Step 4), talking to someone to let God in (Step 5), asking for the character defect to be removed (Steps 6 and 7), and then making things right (Steps 8 and 9).

But knowing what to do and having the power to do it are two different things. Lack of power is still my dilemma. I'm an expert at analyzing the world's problems from my armchair but rarely take action. Prayer and meditation, when I follow the path of the Steps, become about enlisting the power to take the right actions. When I do this, meditation is a natural outcome, not something I have to chase.

I have to be careful. My self-centeredness can twist anything, even the Steps. I can pursue meditation as an escape, just as I once used alcohol. I remember trying to make an amend to an old girlfriend, thinking I was being so spiritual. When she mentioned she had a boyfriend, it stopped me in my tracks. I realized my real motive was to cure my own loneliness and horniness. I had to make an amend for that amend later on.

It's funny to think I might need more "evidence" of a higher power to be motivated to pray. I just have to look around an AA meeting to see miracles sitting in every chair—miracles just like you. My goal now is not to find evidence, but to be evidence.

Step 11 gives us the instructions: "Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out." The bonus is that in receiving the power to do His will, we also receive joy.

The St. Francis prayer from the "Twelve and Twelve" is also a perfect roadmap for this.

Lord, make me a channel of thy peacethat where there is hatred, I may bring lovethat where there is wrong, I may bring the spirit of forgiveness that where there is discord, I may bring harmonythat where there is error, I may bring truththat where there is doubt, I may bring faiththat where there is despair, I may bring hope that where there are shadows, I may bring lightthat where there is sadness, I may bring joy. Lord, grant that I may seek rather to comfort than to be comforted to understand, than to be understoodto love, than to be loved. For it is by self-forgetting that one finds. It is by forgiving that one is forgiven. It is by dying that one awakens to Eternal Life. Amen.

My service work isn't always enjoyable. When it gets tough, it's a sign I need to lean on the Steps, Traditions, and Concepts. And in AA service, I am never without fellows who can help me through my frustrations.

Thank you for being here for me and for each other. May we all continue to be evidence of His will and carry this life-saving message of Alcoholics Anonymous
