## DELEGATE

Gathering an informed group conscience for the many agenda items at the upcoming General Service Conference is a significant undertaking, but it is one we are fully capable of achieving. While we navigate the rotations and maintain our focus on effective local service for the still-suffering alcoholic, I believe that our work on the General Service Conference agenda will ultimately strengthen our Area-facing efforts.

To prepare for the Pre-Conference Assembly, we will operate as follows:

1. **Committee Deliverables:** Pre-conference committees will mirror the function of Conference committees. Each committee must review their assigned agenda items, hold a vote, and report the specific vote counts to our April Assembly members.
2. **Voting Members:** Committee Chairs are responsible for establishing who constitutes a voting member within their committee.
3. **Committee Selection:** Unlike previous years where districts were assigned, districts will now have the opportunity to choose which committee they wish to serve on. While some assignments may still be necessary to ensure balanced coverage, we encourage you to select a committee where you feel most engaged.

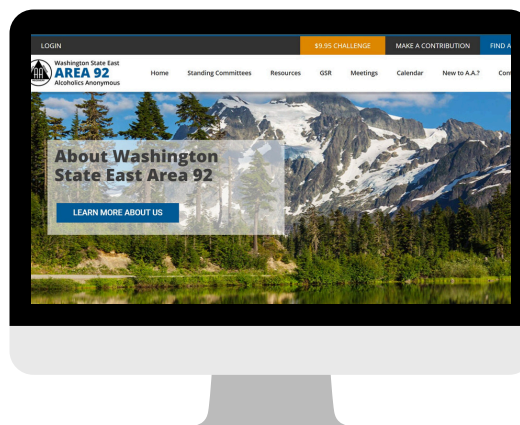

## NEWSLETTER

I am grateful and excited to serve as the new Newsletter Editor for Area 92 during this rotation. It is an honor to take on this position, and I look forward to contributing to improved communication within our Area.

I have made a few updates to how the newsletter is distributed. The newsletter is now being sent using MailerLite, a program similar to MailChimp. This allows us to better track how many emails are successfully delivered, how many are opened, and how many members are engaging with the newsletter. This will help us better understand how the newsletter is being used and where improvements can be made.

In addition, a “Subscribe Now” button has been added to the Area 92 website. This button is located at the bottom of the site and allows members to easily subscribe or unsubscribe at any time. This change will reduce the need to manually manage email lists and databases.

I will also be reaching out to members who currently receive printed newsletters by mail. The monthly cost for printing and mailing is nearly \$500 per month, and since the newsletter is digital and accessible by email, phone, and the website, my hope is to significantly reduce this expense. I plan to have thoughtful conversations with those members to explore alternatives.

Reducing these costs may allow the Area to better support other service needs, possibly including new service positions. I am excited about the year ahead and grateful for the opportunity to serve.

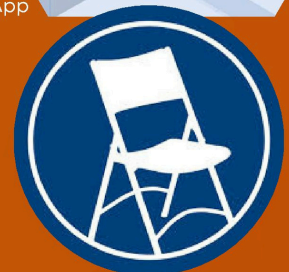
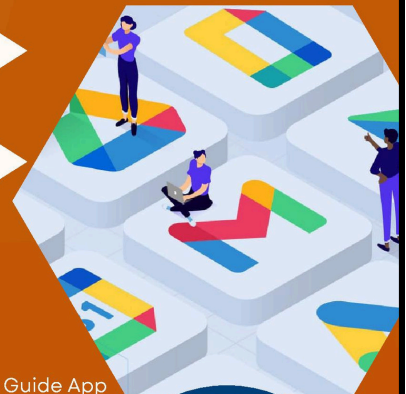



# General Service Conference Committees

Committee	Focus & Responsibilities
I. Agenda	Reviews and approves the General Service Conference agenda, focusing on themes, presentation topics, and scheduling to ensure business is conducted effectively.
II. C.P.C.	(Cooperation with the Professional Community) Focuses on communication with professionals (doctors, clergy, law enforcement, etc.). The goal is to inform them what A.A. is (and is not) and how to refer clients to us.
III. Corrections	Coordinates efforts to carry the message to alcoholics in prisons and jails. Includes arranging meetings behind the walls and setting up "Prerelease Contacts" for transition into the local community.
IV. Finance	Reviews financial affairs, including the budget, contributions, and literature sales. Ensures the principle of self-support is maintained and funds are used prudently.
V. Grapevine / La Viña	Supports the production/distribution of our "meetings in print." Members encourage subscriptions, collect stories, and use the magazines as tools for recovery and unity.
VI. Literature	Reviews existing A.A. literature and suggestions for new items. Ensures printed materials reflect current A.A. experience and reach the alcoholic who still suffers.
VII. Policy / Admissions	Responsible for Conference procedure and policy. Handles the admissions process for guests, observers, and translators.
VIII. Public Information (P.I.)	Coordinates PSAs and provides accurate information to the media and public. Ensures the public understands the program while maintaining anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films.
IX. Report & Charter	Responsible for the A.A. Service Manual and Conference Charter. Updates documents to reflect Conference actions and reviews the Final Conference Report.
X. Treatment & Accessibilities	Carries the message to treatment centers and hospitals. Also addresses "Accessibilities," ensuring A.A. is available to those with physical, mental, geographic, or language barriers.
XI. Trustees	Reviews resumes/qualifications of Trustee candidates. Handles nominating procedures and the composition of the General Service Board.
XII. Archives	dedicated to the collection, preservation, and organization of A.A. historical documents and artifacts for future generations.
